THE CLOTHESLINE PROJECT

The first Clothesline Project started in Hyannis, MA in 1990 by a member of the Cape Cod's Women's Defense Agenda after learning that 51,000 U.S. women were killed by intimate partners. This motivated them to create a program that would speak up and reveal the issue of violence against women. Visual artist, Rachel Carey-Harper, thought of hanging color-coded t-shirts on a clothesline in a public place to raise awareness.
